

# Corten Steel Planters

Over time, your planter will develop a deep and warm, non-corrosive patina. If you'd like to speed up the weathering process, here's a recipe that worked for us. Your own results may vary depending on location and climate.

## You'll need:

2 oz. White Vinegar

16 oz. Hydrogen Peroxide

½ tbsp. Salt

Safety Goggles

Gloves

Spray Bottle

1. Put on your safety goggles and gloves. **Caution:** cover any surfaces that may come into contact with run-off from the weathering process, as it will stain.
2. Add the hydrogen peroxide, salt, and white vinegar to your spray bottle. Shake vigorously to dissolve the salt.
3. Working your way around the planter, spray each side from top to bottom. Let dry. You can use a dry rag to even out the finish, or leave it as is for a more natural effect.
4. Repeat Step 3 until your planter reaches the desired color.

If you will be using your planter outdoors, remove the plug to allow excess water to drain. You're now ready to plant!
