Nocturne Arch

The Nocturne Arch makes a striking statement with its combination of aged bronze and brass foil finish. It's sturdy enough to support your favorite annual and perennial vines.

Parts

- (2) Bottom Side Panels
- (2) Top Side Panels
- (2) Arches
- (5) Braces
- (4) Stakes

Recommended Tools

- Rubber Mallet
- Step ladder

Assembly

NOTE: Assembly requires two people. The pieces of the Arch are heavy. Please be careful when handling them.

Step 1. We recommend assembling the arch where you intend to install it. Select a location that is protected from high winds and is away from children's play areas. **NOTE:** Because the Arch is heavy, we recommend securing it in concrete. If you are installing it directly into the ground, please make sure your soil is firm.

Step 2. Line up the designs on a Top and Bottom Side Panel as shown in Figure 1. Slide the hollow ends on the Top Panel over the prongs on the Bottom Panel. Repeat to assemble the other side of the Arch.

Step 3. Start forming the Arch on the ground by laying the assembled Side Panels on their sides, parallel to each other. **NOTE:** The fronts of the Panels (shown in Figure 1) should be facing out.

Examine the Arches to find the attached loops (Figure 2). Slide the ends of the Arches into the openings in the Top Side Panels, with the attached loops facing in.




Step 4. With at least two people, carefully lift the Arch so it is upright. Make sure the sides are straight, then press the ends of the Bottom Side Panels into the ground, marking it. Move the Arch to the side and use your rubber mallet to gently pound the Stakes into the marked spots. Place the open ends of the Arch over the tops of the Stakes.

Step 5. Use your stepladder to place the Braces into the loops on the Arches (Figure 2). Your assembly is complete!

The powder-coated steel Arch is weather-resistant and can be left outdoors year-round. However, if the finish is nicked or scratched, use an exterior-grade metal paint to prevent rust.
